TVs, computers, printers:

Furniture: If it's on our "do not accept list" or if the thrift shop does not have room to fit your furniture inside the store, and it is in fair condition, you might try the Seattle Goodwill which is a ten minute drive from here. To verify their current acceptance policy, contact information is provided below. You can also try a Craigslist "curb alert" in the "free" section of this website.

If the furniture is damaged or is on the Consumer Product Safety Recall list, you may need to dispose of the item at the Factoria Transfer Station. Other recycling options can be found on the King Count Solid Waste website which is listed below.


